



As we know recycling helps the environment by freeing up landfill space from unnecessary items and keeps trees from being harvested. It is estimated that over 40% of landfill space is made up of paper products, and one ton of recycled paper saves 17 trees from being harvested and 3 cubic yards of landfill space.

In continuing our stewardship to protecting the earth and the environment, Beaverdam Reformed Church will begin to recycle papers with PaperGator®. This paper is shredded and processed into hydroseeding mulch, lawn establishment products, lawn repair products, cat litter, dog litter and small animal bedding. These products are sold locally, nationally, and internationally. The church is paid for collecting the papers in the recycling bin that is provided for us. A PaperGator® truck will come and empty the bin on a regular basis, so it will never be too full for you to recycle your papers.

What can go in the bin?

- Newspapers
- Catalogs/Magazines
- Junk Mail
- Phone Books
- Office/School Paper

Just think of how much extra paper comes into your house, that doesn't need to go to the landfill. Let's continue to be good stewards of our resources, and at the same time earn money to support the church.

Please be mindful of what is **NOT** accepted:

- Cardboard
- Plastic (including plastic bags)
- Metal
- Trash
- Glass
