# Fairfield Good News

**WORSHIPPING THE LORD FOR 300 YEARS!** 

March 2020

From the desk of Pastor Scott:

"Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan River, being urged by the Spirit out into the barren wastelands of Judea, where Satan tempted him for forty days. He ate nothing all that time, and was very hungry." (Luke 4:1-2 TLB.)



The church, like nature, is defined by its seasons – just as there is in the natural order; fall, winter, summer and spring – so too the church follows a cycle of Christmas, Lent, Easter and Pentecost. We are now in the season of Lent.

In the early church, Lent was the season of preparation for those people who wished to join the church. During the forty days of Lent, these people prepared themselves for baptism and church membership by focusing on spiritual discipline and self-denial. When those forty days came to end on Easter, these Christians were baptized and partook of the Lord's supper with their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Today the season of Lent begins with our remembrance of Jesus' forty days of spiritual preparation in the Judean wilderness following his baptism by John and the start of his public ministry. Fredrick Buechner explains, "After being baptized by John in the river Jordan, Jesus went off alone into the wilderness where he spent forty days asking himself the question what it meant to be Jesus." During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask themselves in one way or another what it means to be themselves (to be a Christian). Lent is a time set aside in the church's life for believers to ask themselves that very question, "Who am I as a Christian? And what does that identity require of me?"



One thing our new identity requires is repentance. Indeed the over-arching theme of the Lenten season is our need to deal seriously with the sin in our lives. One of the Reformed Church's confessions, the Heidelberg Catechism, asks these questions: What is involved in genuine repentance? Two things: The dying-away of the old self and the coming-to-life of the new. What is the dying-away of the old self? It is to be genuinely sorry for sin, to hate it more and more and to run away from it. What is the coming-to-life of the new self? It is wholehearted joy in God through Christ, and a delight to do every kind of good as God wants us to." (HC Lord's Day 33)

The forty days of Lent are a timely reminder that both sides of repentance (the positive and the negative) need to be found in the Christian's life.

G.K. Chesterton once said, "A white post will only continue to be a white post if it is painted white every year; otherwise it will become a black post." Our Christian lives are like that post. We do not stay white. We are in constant need of God's grace. We all sin and fall down in our walk with the Lord. As forgiven sinners nonetheless, we are in need of an annual paint job. The Lenten season is a good time to offer our lives over anew to the paintbrush of God.
