Her children arise and call her blessed;
her husband also, and he praises her:
"Many women do noble things,
but you surpass them all."
Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting;
but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.
Honor her for all that her hands have done,
and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.

(Proverbs 31:28-31)

Consider these words from the great preacher Charles Spurgeon, who in his autobiography reflects upon his mother's love and influence.

"Fathers and mothers are the most natural agents for God to use in the salvation of their children. I am sure that, in my early youth, no teaching ever made such an impression upon my mind as the instruction of my mother. Neither can I conceive that, to any child, there can be one who will have such influence over the young heart as the mother who has so tenderly cared for her offspring. A man with a soul so dead as not to be moved by the sacred name of 'mother' is creation's blot.

Never could it be possible for any man to estimate what he owes to a godly mother. Certainly I have not the powers of speech with which to

set forth my valuation of the choice blessing which the Lord bestowed on me in making me the son of one who prayed for me, and prayed with me.

How can I ever forget her tearful eye when she warned me to escape the wrath to come? I thought her lips right eloquent. Others might not think so, but they certainly were eloquent to me. How can I ever forget when she bowed her knee, and with her arms about my neck, prayed, 'Oh, that my son might live before Thee!' Nor can her frown be effaced from my memory,— that solemn, loving frown, when she rebuked my budding iniquities.

And her smiles have never faded from my recollection,— the beaming of her countenance when she rejoiced to see some good thing in me towards the Lord God of Israel."

Most of us can echo the words of Spurgeon. What a tremendous influence our mothers have had upon us! I am so blessed to have a mother who not only prayed for me as I was navigating the early years of my life, but who continues to pray for me each day. Mothers never doubt the power of your words, your prayers, your love and your laughter. God is using you to bless your children even when they are grownup.

So children, as we pause to celebrate our own mothers this month, let us offer up a special prayer of gratitude to God for the godly mothers who have shaped us into the believers we are today. Without their prayers, tears and smiles, who know where we might be today? So, remember to arise and call her blessed, not only one day a year, but all the days of your life.

"Under the bright Mediterranean sun, the smell of exhaust fills the air. A line of cars stretches on and on. You're waiting to board one of the many ferries that travel from the ports of southern Europe to North Africa. From freedom to oppression.

Your car inches forward, the kids in the backseat squirm. They're already bored, and the journey will take as many as 36 more hrs. Suddenly, there's a soft knock at the window. The person is smiling, holding out a pack of something. You open the window and they tell you it's a gift. When you look down, you see an Arabic New Testament...a movie about Jesus...a book for children that tells the story of the Bible and more.

You know what this is. You know the danger of taking it back into your closed homeland. You risk jail or worse to have a Bible in your possession. But you've always wondered about Christianity, the gift is free and you may never get another chance to read a Bible. In that minute, you make a decision and grasp that gift—a divine appointment placing the truth in your hands for the very first time."

For 25 years Cru (Campus Crusade for Christ) teams have stood at the border ports and handed out these packs. This year our church has paid for 100 packs (\$500 taken from our Missions budget) to reach 100 of these families. Pray that those families will seek the truth!
