



# Youth Matter, and So Do Adults!

I recently took a course called "Youth Mental Health First Aid" that was provided free of charge to librarians who work with children and young adults. The training, provided by Mental Health First Aid USA,

is a public education program which introduces how adults can recognize risk factors

And warning signs of youth who may be experiencing a mental health challenge. As a librarian, this was helpful to me because they provided local resources and ideas for talking to youth and their parents about how to get help.

As a youth group leader and church member, what I learned was more important. During the course, our instructor mentioned that the number one way to prevent suicide among youths is for them to have a relationship with a trusted adult. While we might assume that these need to be deep, meaningful relationships, they don't have to be. Having an adult who smiles when they see a teen and asks how their day is or jokes around with the youth can be more than enough. It could be the guy pouring your coffee every day at the deli or the church member who greets you with a hug.

Youth Mental Health First Aid recommends the following steps when dealing with a crisis:

- Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- Listen without judgment
- •Give reassurance and information
- Encourage appropriate professional help
- •Encourage self-help and other support strategies

However, these steps don't need to be used just in crisis. We should be able to listen without judgment and give reassurance and information at all times.

It is important to remember that your actions matter to the youth around you. Take a moment to talk to the youth at church, find out what their favorite sports team is, what grade they are in, or even their favorite drink. You never know how these small interactions will influence their life (and yours!).

#### Legacy Garden

The Endowment Committee is proposing a long-term program directed to the beautification of the grounds surrounding the Church and the Gerrit Heemstra Memorial Building (Friendship Hall). The first phase in this program is the creation of the Legacy Garden prominently located in the roughly triangular area next to the playground and to the right of the west side entrance of the Heemstra Building. Within the Garden will be an area consisting of engraved commemorative bricks that will be surrounded by bushes, shrubs, two benches and a central tree planting. The inscriptions on these bricks may, for example, commemorate a deceased loved one, or celebrate a family or a special event such as an anniversary, wedding, birth of a child, or honor a living person. Your purchase of a commemorative brick will not only make a special remembrance for you but also will make you a participant in the creation of the Legacy Garden and in the long term improvement program of the Pompton Reformed Church grounds.
