Associate Pastor's Report*

"The opposite of the happy ending is not actually the sad ending--the sad ending is sometimes the happy ending. The opposite of the happy ending is actually the unsatisfying ending."

In the last few weeks, I have been trying to tie up loose ends. I have wanted to make sure everything was done and I am not leaving anything left undone or misplaced, but today I decided that was an impossible and impractical task and turned my thoughts to what it looks like to have a satisfying ending.

In the last 24 hours I have had the privilege to sit with two different people I care for deeply and listen to their stories of pain and hurt and a longing for God to come near. After both encounters I was struck once again with the awesome privilege it is to be a pastor and humbled to the point of tears that God has allowed me this privilege here at PRC and that God has now seen fit to call me to love and serve and experience that same privilege in Hasbrouck Heights.

Tom teased me one recent Sunday about my tears and those of you in worship that day got to see me weep during the benediction (the one I practiced so I wouldn't weep), but those tears are probably a necessary part of a satisfying ending. I wept after the recent lock-in with the youth maybe because I was exhausted after being awake for more than 24 hours, but more likely because I won't be here to watch these kids grow into the leaders they themselves will become. A privilege I had in seeing the current Youth Leaders grow from a bunch of unruly youth group kids to adults who lead with passion, integrity, and love. That is the satisfying ending I think, to be able to weep **and** rejoice at the work God has done and will continue to do. I said in my letter to the congregation that I believe that God has placed the right people in the right places to ensure your continued growth as disciples of Jesus and in your love for each other. That assurance is what gives me the ability to let go and trust God for the next steps. All I have to do is look at our current Youth Leaders when I doubt and I am reminded about God's faithfulness to raise the leaders necessary.

I probably will leave stuff undone; no, in fact, I know I will. Please be gracious in your forgiveness. It will take me a while to cart all my books and such out of my office, please be patient. I will weep a lot over the next few weeks, tears of joy, tears of sadness, please share the tissues. But I will never forget your love, grace and desire for God, it has healed me, challenged me, and shaped me as a pastor and now I bring that which I have experienced in you to a new place. That I think is a satisfying ending and a new beginning.

This is a good time to mark May 2-3 on your calendars, as the Care and Kindness Conference returns to New Jersey. This is a weekend event of 25 workshops on a variety of themes, plus three addresses from Keynote Speaker Dr. James Kok. More information can be found on tables throughout the church.

Legacy Garden

The Endowment Committee is proposing a long-term program directed to the beautification of the grounds surrounding the Church and the Gerrit Heemstra Memorial Building (Friendship Hall). The first phase in this program is the creation of the Legacy Garden prominently located in the roughly triangular area next to the playground and to the right of the west side entrance of the Heemstra Building. Within the Garden will be an area consisting of engraved commemorative bricks that will be surrounded by bushes, shrubs, two benches and a central tree planting. The inscriptions on these bricks may, for example, commemorate a deceased loved one, or celebrate a family or a special event such as an anniversary, wedding, birth of a child, or honor a living person. Your purchase of a commemorative brick will not only make a special remembrance for you but also will make you a participant in the creation of the Legacy Garden and in the long term improvement program of the Pompton Reformed Church grounds.
