"All Hearts Go Home for Christmas...

Come find the place where your heart belongs"

This is what is on the front of the postcards the *Mission and Outreach Team* is ordering. It is a true statement I think. Whether we have good memories or bad ones of Christmas seasons gone by, most of us have pretty vivid memories and they often center around home and family.

For those of us who follow Jesus, Advent and Christmas is a special time of year. It is a time to slow down, remember who we are and *whose* we are. We remember the stories of a young mother afraid but trusting in God, stories of a young husband who goes against all logic to follow God's call, of angels singing in the night, of shepherds overjoyed at finding God's message to be true, and stories of a baby born in a barn. We remember Hope, Peace, Joy, Love and fulfilled promises. We remember we have a place in these stories too. We remember that we belong.

For much of the rest of the culture this is sadly no longer true. There might be some distant memories of having a place to belong in the church but, for many around us the church isn't a place where they feel welcome. It isn't a place where they can find themselves in the story of God, it isn't a place where they feel like they belong.

Feeling welcome and belonging <u>always</u> starts with an invitation. Think about it, when was the last time you received a personal invitation to something? Didn't it make you feel a little special? Someone went out of their way to consider you, and then invited you to join them usually for a celebration of some kind, like a wedding or party or for tea around a kitchen table.

For those of us who did not grow up in this church, we are here today because someone invited us. After we came the first time, we came back because we felt welcomed and eventually we found our stories here in the stories of God. That is the intent of the these postcard invitations, to help us consider people we know and personally invite to come and find a place where they can join the stories of their lives with the story of God alive and active in the word today.

In the next few weeks the Mission and Outreach Team will make 500 enveloped invitations available for us to give to people. I would ask you to begin today to pray about the people God would have you invite personally, to join us this Advent and Christmas season. As you pray, listen for the prompting of the Spirit to show you just the right person or people and the right opportunities.

I have no doubt God can and will use us to help people around us find a place where their hearts belong and where they can find that their stories have a place in God's story. In fact, I look forward to hearing how God will use these invitations as a doorway to new friendships and lives changed for eternity.



PRAYER QUILT MINISTRY



It has been over a year now since we began our prayer quilt ministry. It has truly been a blessing to so many who have received the quilts; whether they were received because of a medical issue or other type of trial, or to celebrate a baptism or a life transition, such as high school graduation.

Recently it has come to our attention that some may not remember or understand the process for the distribution of these quilts. The Prayer Quilt Ministry Team as a whole does not choose the recipients. So just to review:

<u>First</u> - when you; yes, YOU, identify a person you believe would benefit from receiving a quilt, ask them if they would be open to receiving one. Perhaps you might want to ask what they would like us to pray for, and it is important that you ask what information about their situation may be shared with others. It may seem strange that someone might not want a quilt, but some might not feel comfortable being a "prayer focus" for a congregation and there is also the issue of confidentiality. A quilt was declined this past year. You may also request a quilt for yourself.

<u>Second</u> – contact Nancy Begin and request the quilt. It is helpful to provide the name *in writing* and any specific prayer request (you can contact Nancy at nbjoyful@optonlone.net). If there is one ready, it will be put out the following Sunday or as soon as one is completed.

<u>Finally</u>,- it is a gift of love and prayer that cannot be bought or sold, so we never accept any form of payment for a prayer quilt.

As a team, we have also been incredibly blessed to be part of the creation of these quilts. New members are welcome any time, no previous experience or skills needed.

Legacy Garden

The Endowment Committee is proposing a long-term program directed to the beautification of the grounds surrounding the Church and the Gerrit Heemstra Memorial Building (Friendship Hall). The first phase in this program is the creation of the Legacy Garden prominently located in the roughly triangular area next to the playground and to the right of the west side entrance of the Heemstra Building. Within the Garden will be an area consisting of engraved commemorative bricks that will be surrounded by bushes, shrubs, two benches and a central tree planting. The inscriptions on these bricks may, for example, commemorate a deceased loved one, or celebrate a family or a special event such as an anniversary, wedding, birth of a child, or honor a living person. Your purchase of a commemorative brick will not only make a special remembrance for you but also will make you a participant in the creation of the Legacy Garden and in the long term improvement program of the Pompton Reformed Church grounds.
