#### **PASTOR'S PEN**

Today is the first day of summer. It is pleasant and promises more pleasant days. Pleasant days need pleasant thoughts. I have pleasant thoughts following my experience as a delegate to our 2007 General Synod meeting in Pella, Iowa. Most folks do not use "Pleasant" and "large ecclesiastical meetings" in the same sentence. But for this synod I can for several reasons. First, it was delegate driven. The representatives of the church spoke loudly and clearly about the direction and methods of mission we understand as proper for the Reformed Church in America. It was a Biblical understanding interpreted by the historic creeds of the Church. It was not some current buzzword management theory that will be replaced as soon as another comes along. There is nothing wrong with new theories of management...for what they are and can do. But they cannot replace the very identity and time tested understandings of who and what it means to be Reformed.

Secondly, we did something new and historic at the same time. We adopted the Belhar Confession for provisional use. That means we are going to test drive a confession to see if it can stand along side our other confessions of faith. We have been looking toward this for 20 years. Ed Mulder was its shepherd within our denomination, and I was sitting with him at the table when it passed. What an honor to watch his joy. What a service he performed for us...to help us be leaders for the whole Church of Christ in looking at what we can confess before the world.

#### The Belhar Confession

The General Synod has provisionally approved for use, the Belhar Confession. We are printing in this edition the Prologue to the Belhar Confession which will provide some history of the confession. The entire confession, because of its length, will be printed in installments.

#### Prologue

The Belhar Confession has its roots in the struggle against apartheid in Southern Africa. This "outcry of faith" and "call for faithfulness and repentance" was first drafted in 1982 by the Dutch Reformed Mission Church (DRMC) under the leadership of Allan Boesak. The DRMC took the lead in declaring that apartheid constituted a status confession is in which the truth of the gospel was at stake.

The Dutch Reformed Mission Church formally adopted the Belhar Confession in 1986. It is now one of the "standards of unity" of the new Uniting Reformed Church of Southern Africa (URCSA). Belhar's theological confrontation of the sin of racism has made possible reconciliation among Reformed churches in Southern Africa and has aided the process of reconciliation within the nation of South Africa.

Belhar's relevance is not confined to Southern Africa. It addresses three key issues of concern to all churches: unity of the church and unity among all people, reconciliation within church and society, and God's justice. As one member of the URCSA has said, "We carry this confession on behalf of all the Reformed churches. We do not think of it as ours alone." The Belhar Confession was provisionally adopted for two years of testing by the RCA's 2007 General Synod.
